¹And now it came to pass that when Nephi had said these words, behold, the[-][-]re were men who were judges, who also belonged to the secret band of Gadianton, and they were angry, and they cried out against him, saying unto the people: Why do ye not seize up[-][-]on this man and bring him forth, that he may be condemned according to the crime wh[-][-]ich he has[-] done?

²Why seest thou this man, and hearest him revile against this people and against our law?

³For behold, Nephi had spoken unto them concerning the corruptness of their law; yea, many things did Nephi speak which can[_]not be written; and nothing did he speak which was cont[_]rary to the commandments of God.

⁴And those judges were angry with him because he spake plainly unto them concerning their secret works of dark[-][-]ness; nevertheless, they du[_]rst not lay their own hands upon him, for they feared the people lest they should cry out against them.

Therefore they did cry unto the people, saying: Why do you suffer this man to revile against us? For behold he doth condemn all this people, even unto destruction; yea, and [_]also[_ _ _] that these our great cities shall be taken from us, that we shall have no place in them.

⁶And now we kno[-][-]w that this is impossible, for behold, we are powerful, and our cities great, therefore our enemies can have no power over[X] us.

⁷And it came to pass that thus they did stir up the people to anger against Nephi, and raised contentions among them; for there were some who did cry out: Let this man alone, for he is a good man, and those things which he sai[_]th
[_]will[_ _ _] surely come to pass except we repent;

SYea, behold, all the judgments will come upon us which he has __ testified unto us; for we know that he has __ testified aright unto us concerning our iniquities. And behold they are many, and he knoweth as well all things which shall befall us as he knoweth of our iniquities;

& now it came to pass that when Nephi had said these words behold the--re were men which were Judges which also belon(ge)d to the secret band of Gadianton & they were angry & they cried out against him saying unto the people why do ye not seaze up--on this man & bring him forth that he may be condemned according to the crime wh--ich he hath done

why seest thou this man & hearest him revile against this people & against our law

for behold Nephi had spoken unto them concerning the corruptness of their law yea many things did Nephi speak which can not be written & nothing did he speak which were conterary to the commandments of God

& those Judges were angry with him because he spake plane unto them concerning their secret works of dark--ness nevertheless they dearst not lay their own hands upon him for they feared the people lest they should cry out against them

therefore they did cry unto the people saying why do you suffer this man to revile against us for behold he doth condemn all this people even unto destruction yea & a(also)lso that these our great cities shall be taken from us that we shall have no place in them

now it came to pass that thus 347 they did stir up the people to anger against Nephi & raised contentions among them for there were some which did cry out let this man alone for he is a good man & those things which he saieth w(will)ith surely come to pass except we repent

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yea & behold if he had not been a prophet he could not have testified concerning those things

& it came to pass that those people which sought to destroy Nephi were compelled because of their fear that they did not lay their hands on hi--m therefore he began again to speak unto them seeing that he had gained favour in the eyes of some insomuch that the remainder of them did fear

therefore he was constra--ined to speak more unto them saying Behold my brethren have ye not red that God gave power unto one man even Moses to smite upon the waters of the Red Sea & they departed hither & thither insomuch that the Israelites which were our fathers came through upon dry ground & the waters closed upon the armies of the Eg--yptians & swallowed them up

& now behold if God gave unto this man such po-wer then why should ye dispute among yourselves & say that he hath given unto me no power whereby I may know concerning the Judgments that shall come upon you exce--pt ye repent

& now behold Moses did not only testify of these things but also all the holy prophets from his day even to the days of Abraham

yea & behold Abraham saw of his coming & was filled with d gladness & did rejoice

¹⁰And it came to pass that those people who sought to destroy Nephi were compelled because of their fear, that they did not lay their hands on hi[-][-]m; therefore he began again to speak unto them, seeing that he had gained favo[_]r in the eyes of some, insomuch that the remainder of them did fear.

¹⁴Yea, did he not bear record that the Son of God shou[-]ld come? And as he lifted up the brazen serpent in the wilderness, even so shall he be lifted up who should come.

¹⁵And as many as should look upon that serpent should live, even so as many as should look upon the Son of God with faith, ha[-][-]ving a contrite spirit, might live, even unto that life which is eternal.

¹⁶And now behold, Moses did not only testify of these things, but also all the holy prophets, from his days even to the days of Abraham.

¹⁷Yea, and behold, Abraham saw of his coming, and was filled with [_] gladness and did rejoice.

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yea & behold I say unto you that Abraham not only knew of the-se things but there were many before the days of Abraham which were called by the ord-er of God yea even after the order of his Son & this that it should be shewn unto the peo--ple a great many thousand years before his coming that even redemption should come unto them

& now I would that ye should know that even since the days of Ab--raham that there hath been many prophets that hath testified these things yea behold the prophet Zenos did testify boldly for the which he was slain

- ²⁰And behold, also Zenock, and also Ez[_]ias, and also Isaiah, and Jeremiah, (Jeremiah being that same prophet who testified of the destruction of Jerusalem) and now we kn[-]ow that Jerusalem was destroyed according to the words of Jeremiah. O then why not the Son of God come, according to his prophecy?
- ²¹And now will you dispute that Jerusalem was [X] destroyed? Will ye say that the sons of Zedekiah were not slain, all except it were Mulek? Yea, and do ye not behold that the seed of Zedekiah are with us, and they were driven out of the land of Jerusalem? But behold, this is not all—
- ²²Our father Lehi was driven out of Jerusalem because he testified of these things. Nephi also testified of these things, and also almost all of our fathers, even down to this time; yea, they have testified of the coming of Christ, and have looked forward, and have rejoiced in his day which is to come.
- ²³And behold, he is God, and he is with them, and he did manifest himself unto them, that they were redeemed by him; and they gave unto him glory, because of that which is to come.
- ²⁴And now, seeing ye know these things and cannot deny them except ye shall lie, therefore in this ye have sinned, for ye have rejected all these things, notwithstanding so many evidences which ye ha[-][-]ve received; yea, even ye have received all things, both things in heaven, and all things which are in the earth, as a witness that they are true.

²⁶Yea, even at this time ye are ripening, because of your murders and your fornication and wick[-][-]edness, for everlasting destruction; yea, and except ye repent it will come unto you soon.

²⁷Yea, behold it is now even at your doors; yea, go ye in unto the judgment-seat, and sea[-][-]rch; and behold, your judge is murdered, and he lieth in his blood; and he hath been mur[-][-]dered by his brother, who seeketh to sit in the judgment-seat.

²⁸And behold, they both belong to your secret band, whose author is Gadianton and the evil one who seeketh to des[-][-]troy the souls of men.
