#### Philemon 1:1

Paul, a prisoner of Jesus Christ,  
and Timothy *our* brother, unto Philemon  
our dearly beloved, and fellowlabourer,

#### Philemon 1:2

And to *our* beloved Apphia, and Archippus our  
fellowsoldier, and to the church in thy house:

#### Philemon 1:3

Grace to you, and peace, from God our Father  
and the Lord Jesus Christ.

#### Philemon 1:4

I thank my God, making mention of thee  
always in my prayers,

#### Philemon 1:5

Hearing of thy love and faith, which thou hast  
toward the Lord Jesus, and toward all saints;

That the communication of thy faith may  
become effectual by the acknowledging  
of every good thing which is in you
